

I am even more impressed that you are talking to your friends and neighbors about what we are doing, and they are getting involved. We have built an amazing little network of folks in the community that are willing to donate all sorts of things. That's thanks to your effort and tour Facebook pages. The next step is to invite them to worship with us!

In early 2024 there are a couple of opportunities for you to get involved in new ways. The first is an old tradition that we are changing and bringing back in a new way. Do you remember the old days when cute little children wandered around with buckets to collect "Pennies for Hunger" to benefit the food ministries of Salem Presbytery? I was thinking about that the other day. Most of the kids that collected pennies are now driving or at least in high school. We are bringing back the penny buckets. I want to give you advanced warning because they are not coming back for the same reason. We kind of just stopped doing it because the kids got older and the excitement about sending money to an unknown place waned. Now there is a new generation of children and an exciting new reason to take up the collection. The buckets won't look the same! They will be decorated in orange. You might be wondering why that is? It is because on the third Sunday of each month we will be collecting all of your loose change (we will accept paper money and checks too) for the Orange Feather Community School. The goal is to raise \$2500 annually through your change. Frank Twum – Barimah is working so hard to have a lasting impact on those kids. I talk to him almost every week. Our preschool is in a relationship with Orange Feather. I am excited about this chance to help them consistently throughout the year.

If you aren't aware of Orange Feather or Frank, please ask Pastor Jay or one of the Elders. Frank was sponsored by this church and Rev. George Carpenter over 20 years ago. Now God has brought him back into our lives. I look forward to the sound of change pinging in those buckets once again to help those children. The first official collection is January 21st start cleaning out your car or couch and have your change ready!

The other opportunity I am excited about this winter is the Christian Life Study Series. These will happen once a month from now until the summer. I will be leading you in a lesson of sorts and then breaking into table groups to have some discussion. There is a free dinner included and childcare available. Once again, we are resurrecting something from our past in a different way. The topic this winter/spring is prayer. This will not be a boring lecture or speech on why you are praying the wrong way or not often enough. This is a series designed to bring your prayer life to the next level. Our intent is to teach you different styles of prayer, strategies for praying, and some practices that will open up your communication with the Lord. The weeks will grow on one another but they will be stand alone lessons so even if you miss one you can still come to the next. I promise you will learn something and grow in you faith even if you make just one! You will be hearing more about this all month. Join us for the first one in the Fellowship Hall (even though the CLC is the Christian Life Center) at 5:30 on 1/31. I promise you will love this series!

More than anything get excited! Look and listen for ways to serve the Lord in 2024 because it is going to be a great one at JPC! See you in church!
