

FROM PASTOR JAY

The Season of Lent always sneaks up on me. This year more than any other this is true because Easter is so early. I think that Easter is almost as early as it can possibly be? (I Googled this and the earliest Easter can be is March 22^{nd}). This is also a special February because of the way the calendar aligns. I think it is exceedingly rare because there are 4 of each day in the month because of the leap year and if I remember correctly this is the only



time this will happen in our lifetimes. I don't think it can happen again for 800 or more years. This month is also unique because Christian days and Hallmark days melt together. Ash Wednesday and Valentine's Day are the same day. I even joked that perhaps Sammie and I should impose heart shaped ashes so that lovebirds could look morbidly festive at dinner.

For the most part, Lent doesn't really impact the life of a Presbyterian too much. We might adopt the habit of giving something up for Lent or something like that, but I know that I enjoy meat on most Fridays and don't feel any guilt at all. Even the practice of imposing ashes is a relatively new practice in the Protestant church in America.

Lent is a season of preparation. It is a season of focus. It is a time that we should intentionally seek to draw closer to God. Maybe your focus will include the Life Center Series which began last night and the commitment to prayer that went with it. Maybe you will take on a new devotional reading or spend more time in God's word.

Giving things up for Lent is not meant to be a punishment. Lent is not meant to be that final weight loss cram before swimsuit season. It is a time of practicing disciplines. This is why it is so easy to simply exchange giving up for adding. The practice of preparing for Lent is the practice of harnessing and focusing your spiritual life and journey to be more focused on Christ. It is really up to you whether that means giving up or adding.

I am really excited about our series on prayer. If you missed the first one, there is still space for you. I hope that each of you is working in your prayer journal. I also hope that prayer could be one our Lenten disciplines. Almost ¼ of the church jumped on board with the study. I hope that we can have a meaningful Lent and spring together.

To sum it all up, what is the purpose of Lent? Lent is a Christian season of practice, celebrated by some Christians though not all. It's not a prescription for holiness, but an invitation to relationship. Lent has its roots in the very early church, with some of those roots in preparation for baptism. During Lent the Scriptures remind us of God's expectations for Israel, Jesus' temptation in the wilderness and his journey to the cross. Lent is a chance for us to practice, every year, focusing on God in Christ. We remember God as immersed in earthly life with our earthly practices.

This season I invite you to remember, to draw closer, and to focus on Christ. May your Lent be one that is fruitful to your faith journey and relationship to the Lord. May we as a congregation also strive to have a meaningful impact on our community this Lenten season. One other hope I have for us is that we are more bold in telling the world about Jesus and sharing the life changing grace of Jesus Christ.


LADIES MORNING CIRCLE
