The Best Laid Plans

In November of 1785 Robert Burns was plowing his field. As he did, he accidentally plowed over the nest of a field mouse. He was upset by this because it was nearing winter and it seemed unlikely that the poor mouse would be able to get ready for the winter having lost everything. He was so moved by this he wrote the poem *To A Mouse* in which he expresses his remorse to the now homeless mouse. In the poem he wrote the line, "The best laid schemes o' Mice an' Men, Gang aft agley," and the world would never be the same. On a side note, I Googled the phrase "Gang aft agley," and it appears that this means "Often go awry," in ancient Scottish.

From this poem we have adopted the proverb that is used to suggest that even the most careful planning doesn't necessarily ensure success. An example of this is "today I had planned to do lots, but as they say the best laid plans of mice and men!" I have heard this over the years. I think my grandmother or maybe even my great grandmother even said it from time to time. It was not until last week that it really hit home. It has been a blessing to work out there. Her family has been actively working with us. I am excited to get back out on that roof. BUT...

There is a but! This Saturday (May 4th) is the last day we planned. Now you must realize that I am writing this article before the second workday BUT unless Jesus and his angels descended from heaven while I was gone this weekend there is no way we will get done on May 4th. We had originally planned to do half of the roof one day and the other half the next. This was not possible because the roof was worse than we could have ever imagined. In some sections there is almost nowhere to safely step. This means less workers on the roof. This means removing and replacing more wood. This means slower progress. Now don't get me wrong. I am not complaining. I am thankful that I get to use my own shower and sleep in my own bed after each day of work. I also think this is possibly the greatest NEED we have seen in all the home repair trips I have personally made with the church. I understand in the early days of Sunset Gap there was real need, but I find myself wondering on some of the jobs. This is not the case here!

Now what? Our plans are in ruins like the nest of the poor fieldmouse. We have a choice. We can complain and be upset. We can make excuses about being too busy. Or we can find some volunteers and finish the work. Of course, you know we will get it done. I hope that when you read the thank you note she sent after the first day you will see how thankful this family is. I invite you to consider being a part of the effort. You can pray, intentionally, each Saturday morning we are out there. This roof is dangerous. We can certainly use your prayers. Perhaps you can be a part of the team that makes our lunch and delivers it? This is a hungry crew and we are so thankful for our support team. As we near the end of the project there will probably be some paint work and some beautification elements to what we are doing. Maybe that is your specialty?

Years ago, several JPC members gathered and worked together to bring a free event to our local community called Celebration. It was a huge Outreach undertaking meant to provide fun, food and entertainment at no charge to the public, and

it was an incredible success. Hundreds of families came to our church and enjoyed games and rides and more, while the entire church came together and volunteered to help. Sadly, Covid arrived, and the event was cancelled.

Until a year ago, when it was proposed that the event be brought back. Session approved it, and several brave leaders came forward to help get the event back up and running. The group wanted to emphasize the word "Celebrate!" so the name was changed, and suddenly we all noticed the word popping up during Worship sermons, in the music played and even during the Children's message! Countless hours were spent planning and preparing. Donations were gathered. T-shirts were printed. Invitations were sent. And on October 7th, 2023, JPC hosted Celebrate! Hundreds of people once again flocked to our Campus including those from Family Services, Haynes-Inman, JPC Preschool, Millis Road Elementary, Pilot Elementary, Church World Service and others. We wanted to offer free activities, food, and fun for families who otherwise might not be able to enjoy these offerings. We chose a Scripture verse to guide us: Galatians 6:10 which reads, "Therefore, as we have opportunity, let us do good to all people, especially to those who are of the household of faith."

Celebrate! Will be here this October on the 5th from 10am-2pm, and we are counting on our members here at JPC to help once again.
