

THOUGHTS FROM PASTOR JAY

We've Always Done It That Way!

I think that this is the battle cry of the Presbyterian. In fact, I have often wondered at what point, after Scottish immigrants made their way to this country seeking religious freedoms, did the first person object crying out, "but we've always done it that way!" I will admit that I don't hear this as often here in a younger church. The last church I served was 220 years older than JPC and the "we've always done it that way," badge of honor had been passed on for generations. At that church, I wondered if families passed this responsibility down or if it passed dutifully to the next in line on the matriarch order of succession.

Now don't get me wrong, I loved that church. In some ways I loved it and continue to love it more than JPC because it was my first solo pastorate. Just as I can tell you all about my first bicycle, first car, and first girl I kissed, I must admit there will always be a place reserved in my heart for Poplar Tent. I also don't believe that most people when they say these words do so to be mean, controlling, or hurtful. I think it is a programed, almost natural, response when called to step out of our comfort zone or try something new or to admit that the way we are doing something might not be the best.

I must admit that I am currently in the middle of a situation that has me tempted to say this! I am very excited about the new class of elders that we will be introducing to you this fall. I think it is a great balance of people with wonderful experiences and leadership skills to bring to leading this congregation. The tempting thing for me to do would be to teach the same old elder training and simply go through the motions. The problem is that we have recognized that the number one complaint of new elders is that they don't feel prepared for what they are stepping into.

My temptation to pull out the old file because, "that's the way we have always done it," is really a disservice to the church and to each of these individuals that have agreed to serve. Sure, there are some things that folks need to know from my old training modules but there are several things that I have just assumed over the years that need to be pointed out. This will result in a better understanding of what our church does, what is expected of them, and how we can determine if what we are doing is working.

Change is hard. We are often afraid of it. This week I am not preaching so I have tried to clear off the list of things I have been avoiding. If you remember back to our Romans I2 series, this is exactly what we are called to do! Here is Romans I2:2 in the New Living Translation. "Don't copy the behavior and customs of this world, but let God transform you into a new person by changing the way you think." Maybe this translation for me should say, "Do not copy the behaviors and customs of this world and don't be afraid to let go of what isn't working."

What do you need to let go of? What do you need to resist the temptation of the same old way? God will give you the strength. In fact, as soon as I email this article to Jen I am going to get to work on that hard list, that list of things that might mean changes for me. I can't wait for God to bless this church and this community through the gifts and leadership of these new elders, trained in a totally new way! See you in church!

Author and pastor Andy Stanley explains what made the earliest Christian movement so compelling and resilient...and what we need to change today to make it so again.






THURSDAY MORNING WOMEN'S BIBLE STUDY...

...that there is an Admin Ministry Team that provides orderly and effective administrative processes for JPC to assure the continuing mission of the church. This team consists of two Elders, two or more members from the congregation and Pastor Jay. The Admin Ministry Team has the following responsibilities:

Assure that the church office has the provisions for the orderly operation of the church office. Provide security services for the congregation and others as they utilize the church facilities. Review contracts and recommend custodial services for church buildings and grounds annually.

Support the pastor in developing personnel policies, job descriptions, setting goals, and evaluating employee performances.

Develop and update annually the wage, salary, and benefit programs for the church staff. Provide oversight of sexual misconduct and Safe Sanctuary policies and ensure their implementation.

Recommend to the Session nominees for Session Leadership including positions for the Church Nominating Committee.

To assist in accomplishing these responsibilities the Admin Ministry Team meets on the 4th Monday of each month to review status. As one can see, based on the responsibilities, members of the Team will develop a good understanding of how the Church functions as well as providing a valuable and rewarding service to the church.

We hope each of you will leave a legacy of service by volunteering in support of JPC.



The next JPC blood drive is Wednesday, October 2 from 2:30 – 7:00 pm. Grab your spot to help save lives!






CHOIR KICK-OFF!


LEISURE FELLOWSHIP
